**What is this consultation about?**

We are asking for your views on proposed road safety improvements on the A5 Cricklewood Broadway between Longley Way and Kara Way. The area covered by the scheme is shown within the red line on the reverse of this letter.

Please read through the information provided and let us know what you think about the proposals by returning the enclosed questionnaire - postage is free. The document and plans of the improvements are also available online at [www.brent.gov.uk/consultation](http://www.brent.gov.uk/consultation). The consultation closes on **Friday 26<sup>th</sup> May 2017**.

**Why are we proposing changes?**

Each year we identify roads and locations in Brent with the highest number of road traffic collisions and look at introducing road safety measures to help reduce the number of accidents.

Over the last three years there have been twenty nine accidents on the A5 Cricklewood Broadway between Longley Way and Kara Way. Out of these accidents, two resulted in serious injury and twenty seven resulted in slight injuries.

Eight collisions involved pedestrians, five involved pedal cyclists and twelve involved motorcycles.

We are therefore proposing to introduce measures to reduce vehicle speeds and improve safety and accessibility for pedestrians and cyclists.

**What are the proposed improvements?**

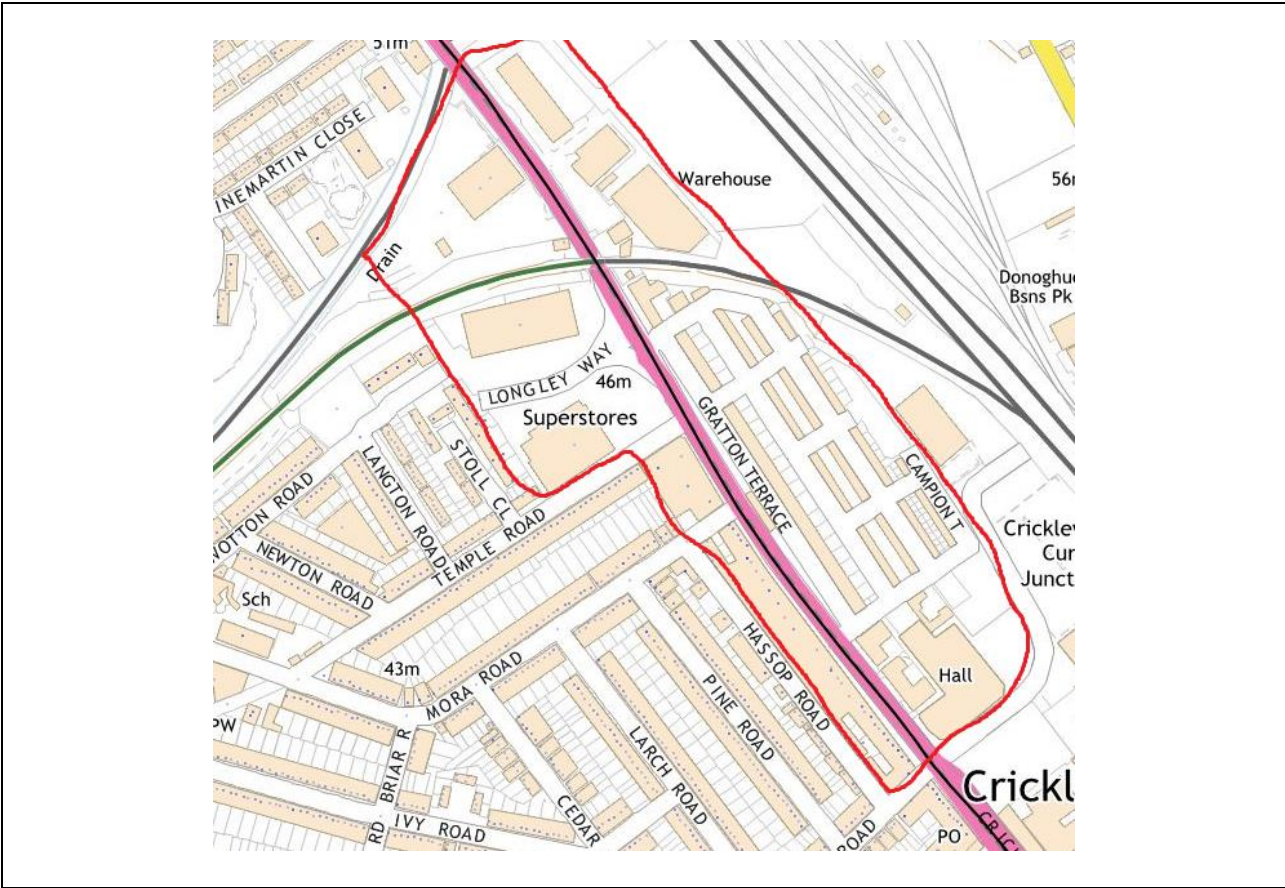
The proposed scheme is shown graphically on the attached drawing. The proposed improvements are summarised below and described in detail in the enclosed explanation sheet:-

- **Vehicle Activated Speed Limit Signs** - Two new vehicle activated speed signs (VAS) are proposed on the footways on Cricklewood Broadway to warn traffic to slow down,
- **Traffic Calming Features** – A raised junction at Longley Way is proposed to help pedestrians. Antiskid surfacing is proposed on the approach to junctions and crossings in order to improve skid resistance and reduce potential traffic accidents,
- **Cycle Lanes and Symbols on the Northbound Carriageway** - To improve road safety for cyclists travelling northbound and to help to reduce conflict between cyclists and motor vehicles.
- **Installation of Yellow Box junction markings** – A number of yellow box junctions are proposed to improve road safety for the turning vehicles
